- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Reevan Spiller, late Cambridge resident and member of the Council on Aging; and
- WHEREAS: Reevan was a 1939 graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and continued his education at the Harvard Business School, receiving a Master's in Business Administration in 1941; and
- WHEREAS: Reevan had been associated with the United States Bureau of Statistics in Boston and the Marilyn Sandal Company of Stoneham, prior to being named comptroller for the Combined Jewish Philanthropies of Greater Boston; a position he held for 22 years, retiring in 1979; and
- WHEREAS: Reevan, in addition to his service as a member of the Council on Aging, was also active as head of the City-wide Parent Teacher Association and the Cambridge Civic Association in the late 1950's and 1960's; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Gertrude Spiller and to the entire Spiller family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
