- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that the members of the Cambridge Fire Rescue Squad have performed an extraordinary public service; and
- WHEREAS: While responding to an emergency call on Monday, June 23, 1980 that an expectant mother needed to be transported to the Cambridge Hospital; and
- WHEREAS: It became apparent during the trip to the hospital that the expectant mother was about to give birth, consequently the members of the Rescue prepared themselves should it become necessary to provide medical assistance; and
- WHEREAS: At 3:55 a.m. as the Rescue was about to pull into the Cambridge Hospital Parking Lot the members of the Squad, Acting Lieutenant William Hunter, Firefighter Thomas Connarton and Firefighter Robert Currier delivered a healthy seven pound seven ounce baby boy and brought both mother and baby into a surprised but happy emergency room at the hospital; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere appreciation for a job "well done" to Acting Lieutenant Hunter and Firefighters Connarton and Currier who's actions once again serve to point out the true professionalism of the members of the Fire Rescue Squad; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to these men and to Chief of the Department, Daniel J. Reagan for inclusion in their personnel file.
