COUNCILLOR PREUSSER

- WHEREAS: Inclusion in the Constitution of the United States is the basic right of every citizen; and
- WHEREAS: Women have been and continue to be excluded from the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS: The people of Cambridge view this exclusion of over one half of the population of the United States from the protection of the Constitution as intolerable and in 1976 voted overwhelmingly (70%) for an Equal Rights Amendment to our State Constitution; and
- WHEREAS: The people of the State of Massachusetts voted (60.5%) in favor of the Equal Rights Amendment but are being denied the benefits of it because of the failure of three states to ratify it; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That no Cambridge monies shall be spent on out-of-state travel, food or accommodations expenses for city government employees who attend conventions or meetings in states which have not ratified the Equal Rights Amendment.
