

In Board of Aldermen June 14th 1871
 Resolved: That the public convenience and necessity require that Mason Street from Garden Street to Brattle Street be widened on both sides thereof by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land as shown on a Plan prepared by the City Engineer and now before this Board.
 Therefore Ordered. That so much of the land on either side of said Mason Street as is included between the red lines shown on a Plan of Mason Street drawn by J. G. Chase City Engineer dated May 29th 1871, and now before this Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said Mason Street.
 Ordered. That damages occasioned by said widening, be estimated and awarded as follows.

Ordered: That thirty days be allowed to the persons whose land is taken for said widening, for the removal of their fences, and other property standing on the land so taken as aforesaid.
