WHEREAS: The "10th Annual National Night Out" provides a unique opportunity for **Cambridge** to join forces with thousands of other communities across the country in promoting cooperative, police-community crime and drug prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS: The North Cambridge Crime Task Force, The North Cambridge Crime Watch, the Cambridge Police Department and the Fitzgerald Community School through joint crime and drug prevention efforts in Cambridge, and is supporting **"National Night Out 1993"** locally; and

WHEREAS: It is essential that all citizens of **Cambridge** be aware of the importance of crime prevention programs and impact that their participation can have on reducing crime and drug abuse in **Cambridge**; and

WHEREAS: Police-community partnerships and neighborhood safety and awareness and cooperation are important themes of the **"National Night Out" program**; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council do hereby call upon all citizens of Cambridge to join area Crime Watch Programs and the National Association of Town Watch in supporting **"the 10th. Annual National Night Out"** on August 3, 1993; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council do hereby proclaim, Tuesday, August 3, 1993 as the 1st. Annual National Night Out in Cambridge; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to commend the North Cambridge Crime Task Force, and all the other agencies affiliated with these crime prevention endeavors in the North Cambridge neighborhood on Tuesday, August 3, 1993 at Rindge Field.
