- WHEREAS: Many visually impaired individuals work and reside in Cambridge and in the daily course of their lives are often required to cross streets at extremely busy intersections; and
- WHEREAS: Often times the visually impaired experience difficulty at these intersections, sometimes having trouble realizing when the light is red; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to instruct the Director of Traffic and Parking to conduct a feasibility study relative to the possibility of installing bells at all major intersections and crosswalks where there are working traffic lights in an effort to provide assistance to those who are visually impaired.
