Ordered,

Whereas, by an act of the last Legislature the cities of Somerville and Cambridge are directed to build a sewer through Bridge and Milk Sts in said cities, in order to better accommodate the present and future drainage of said cities, and whereas, in the present width of the street, the building of said sewer is likely to be a great public inconvenience, and cause much interruption to business.

That the Committee on Roads & Bridges be instructed to enquire into the propriety of widening Bridge St on its southerly side from its junction with Cambridge St to the ~~Southerly~~ ^{Somerville} line. and prayed for by many citizens with a view of locating the sewer in said widening.
