To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Aldermen
of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned taxpayers of this city, respectfully
beg leave to again call your attention to the pressing
need of paving a portion of "Prison Point Bridge"
so called.

We deem it unnecessary to ask for a public
hearing believing that your Honorable Board are
fully aware of its condition and need only to be
reminded of it to apply the proper remedy.

Suffice it to say, that it is a great thoroughfare,
a large portion of the travel bring heavy teaming
and the street often in such a condition as to be
almost impassable.

The subject has been prominently before the two
preceding City Governments, both of which have
admitted that the only practicable manner of placing
the street in a proper condition was by paving
the same, but as no appropriation had been made
for it they were not in a position to enter upon
the work.

We earnestly hope the above petition will
receive a favorable consideration.
