CHAPTER 121 ACTS OF THE YEAR 1930

AN ACT Providing for the Licensing in the City of Cambridge of Open Air Parking Spaces and Establishments Letting Motor Vehicles for Hire.

SECTION 1. No person shall engage in the City of Cambridge in the business of conducting or maintaining an open air parking space or an establishment for letting out motor vehicles for hire, however computed or determined, without a license therefor granted by the Board of License Commissioners of said City, hereinafter called the Board. The license shall in either case specify all the premises to be occupied by the licensee for the purpose of conducting the licensed business. The fee for each such license shall be such amount as may be established by the Board, and the Board may reasonably classify said licenses and fees. Licenses granted hereunder shall expire on May first following the date of issue or on such date as may be specified therein, and may be suspended or revoked by the Board. Whoever, not being licensed, engages in said City in a business required to be licensed as aforesaid or is concerned therein, or, being licensed, engages in such business, or is concerned therein, in any other place than that designated in his license, or after notice to him that his license has been suspended or revoked, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance, during the current year, by vote of the City Council of said City, subject to the provisions of its charter. (Accepted by City Council, March 25, 1930, and approved by the Mayor, March 29, 1930.)

REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS

1. Motor vehicles not to be parked within ten feet of any building or other structure.
2. License not to be granted until after a hearing, notice of which shall be sent by the applicant by registered mail to all owners of abutting property.

REGULATIONS FOR KEEPERS OF ANTIQUE SHOPS

RULE 1. No Person shall be a collector of, or a dealer in Second-Hand Furniture, Bric-a-Brac, Art Objects, Paintings, Jewelry, and Antiques or be the keeper of a shop for the keeping of Second-Hand Furniture, Bric-a-Brac, Art Objects, Paintings, Jewelry, and Antiques in this city, unless duly licensed by the Board of License Commissioners, and unless such persons comply with all rules and regulations now and hereafter enacted and passed with reference and application to Second-Hand Furniture, Bric-a-Brac, Art Objects, Paintings, Jewelry, or Antiques.

RULE 2. Each license shall set forth the name of the party licensed, the nature of the business, and the building or place in which it is to be carried on and shall continue in force until the first day of May next ensuing unless sooner revoked by the Board of License Commissioners. Each license shall specify the kind and character of the business to be carried on. No license shall be granted to a person for the purchase, storage, sale, barter or exchange of Second-Hand Furniture, Bric-a-Brac, Art Objects, Paintings, Jewelry, or Antiques unless said person shall conduct his business in a building of first or second class construction which has been approved by the Fire Department.

RULE 3. Every keeper of a shop for the purchase, storage, or sale of Second-Hand Furniture, Bric-a-Brac, Art Objects, Paintings, Jewelry, or Antiques shall keep, a book in which shall be legibly written in the English language at the time of purchase a description thereof, the name, age and residence, giving a street number, when possible, of the person from whom and the day and hour when such purchase was made. No entry in such book shall be changed, erased, obliterated, or defaced. Such book shall be opened at all times to the examination of the Board of License Commissioners or any person authorized by the Board to make such examination.

RULE 4. Every keeper of a shop for the purchase, storage or sale of Antiques shall hold any metal objects including those containing gold, silver, or precious metal that he intends to melt down or otherwise make indistinguishable or unidentifiable for a period of forty-five days from the purchase or acquisition thereof, prior to reselling the same.

RULE 4A. No keeper of a shop shall directly or indirectly receive or sell to a minor or apprentice.

RULE 5. Every such keeper of a shop shall have conspicuously displayed his license as a keeper of an Antique Shop.

RULE 6. A violation of any provision of this license or subsequent rule or regulation that may be passed shall be sufficient cause and reason to revoke said license. The right is granted to the Board of License Commissioners at any time for any other cause sufficient to revoke said license.

RULE 7. Whoever, not being so licensed, keeps such a shop, in any other place or manner than that designated in the license, or who continues, after notice to him of the revocation of his license, shall forfeit Twenty Dollars for each offense; and whoever violates any rule or regulation or restriction contained in his license, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty Dollars for each offense.

RULE 8. The Chief of Police, the Deputy Chief of Police, the Chief of the Fire Department, the Deputy Chief of the Fire Department or any authorized representative of the Cambridge License Commission shall at all times have the authority to inspect or examine all books kept by the keeper of an Antique Shop as well as to inspect and to examine all articles and merchandise therein.

RULE 9. Attention is called to Rule 3 and Rule 6 of the printed regulations of this license.

RULE 10. All dealers in second-hand furniture except household furniture must make weekly reports to Police Headquarters, giving a list of all articles purchased, with accurate description, price paid, time when such articles were purchased and from whom purchased.

General Laws, Chapter 140

Lodging Houses

Section 22. "Lodging house," as used in sections twenty-two to thirty-one, inclusive, shall mean a house where lodgings are let to five or more persons not within the second degree of kindred to the person conducting it, and shall not include dormitories of charitable, educational or philanthropic institutions.

Section 23. As amended by Chapter 59 of the Acts and Resolves of 1921. Licensing Authorities may grant licenses for lodging houses . . . and shall charge for each license such fee, not exceeding two dollars, as the city council or selectmen may establish, otherwise the same shall be granted without charge. Said authorities shall enforce sections twenty-four to thirty-one, inclusive, and shall prosecute all violations thereof.

Section 24. Whoever conducts a lodging house without a license shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not more than three months or both.

Section 25. Premises occupied, used or controlled by licensee under sections twenty-two to thirty-one, inclusive, or under an innholder's license shall be subject to inspection by the licensing authorities and their authorized agents, and by the police on request from the licensing authorities.

Section 26. Whoever, being licensed as a lodging house keeper under sections twenty-two to thirty-one, inclusive, or as an innholder, or being in actual charge, management or control of the premises for which the license is issued, knowingly permits the premises under his control to be used for the purpose of immoral solicitation, immoral bargaining or immoral conduct shall be punished by a fine of not less than five hundred nor more than one thousand dollars or by imprisonment for not less than six months nor more than one year, or both. Evidence that a room in a hotel or lodging house was not actually used for immoral conduct shall not prevent a conviction under this section of a person in actual charge, control or management of the premises who permits the occupation of such a room knowing or having good reason to know that the parties occupying such a room intend to use it for the purposes of immoral solicitation, immoral bargaining or immoral conduct. If it is required that registers be kept, as provided in sections twenty-seven and twenty-eight, evidence that the person in actual charge, control or management of the premises has knowingly permitted the occupation of a private room of less than four hundred square feet floor area, containing a bed or couch, by the same woman on different occasions within a period of thirty days with different men, or by the same man on different occasions within a period of thirty days with different women, shall be prima facie evidence of the violation of this section.

Section 27. Every innholder, and every lodging house keeper required so to do under section twenty-eight, shall keep or cause to be kept, in permanent form, a register in which shall be recorded the true name or name in ordinary use and the residence of every person engaging or occupying a private room averaging less than four hundred square feet

floor area, excepting a private dining room not containing a bed or couch, or opening into a room containing a bed or couch, for any period of the day or night, in any part of the premises controlled by the licensee, together with a true and accurate record of the room assigned such person and of the day and hour when such room is assigned. The entry of the name of the person engaging a room and of the occupant of said room shall be made by said person engaging said room or by an occupant thereof. Until the entry of such name and the record of the room has been made, such person shall not be allowed to occupy privately any room upon the licensed premises. Such register shall be retained by the holder of the license for a period of at least one year after the date of the last entry therein, and shall be open to the inspection of the licensing authorities, their agents and the police. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than three months, or both.

Section 28. Every person conducting a lodging house shall within twenty-four hours after he is ordered to do so by the licensing authorities keep a register. The said authorities may issue such order at any time, and shall do so upon receipt of an affidavit of a commissioned officer of the United States Army or Navy or a police officer stating that the affiant knows or believes such lodging house is being used for immoral solicitation, immoral bargaining or immoral conduct.

Section 29. No person shall write or cause to be written, or if in charge of a register knowingly permit to be written in any register in any lodging house or hotel any other or different name or designation than the true name or name in ordinary use of the person registering or causing himself to be registered therein. No person occupying such room shall fail to register or fail to cause himself to be registered. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than twenty-five dollars.

Section 30. A license issued under sections twenty-two to thirty-one, inclusive, or an innholder's license, shall be revoked, if at any time the licensing authorities are satisfied that the licensee is unfit to hold the license. They may suspend and make inoperative, for such period of time as they may deem proper, the licenses mentioned herein for any cause deemed satisfactory to them. The revocation and suspension shall not be made until after investigation and a hearing, or after giving the licensee an opportunity to be heard; notice of the hearing shall be left at the premises of the licensee not less than three days before the time therefor.

Section 31. All innholders, and all lodging house keepers who have been ordered to keep a register, shall post in a conspicuous place near the register a notice, to be furnished by the licensing authorities, containing the provisions of sections twenty-seven and twenty-nine relating to the entry of names and residences in the register, together with the penalty provided for their violation.
