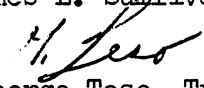

Subject Resident Parking Program—"Concord Ave. and Lexington Ave. Areas"

The implementation of the Resident Parking Program in the City of Cambridge has been delayed due to the fact that the constitutionality of the law was questioned and arguments were heard by the State Supreme Judicial Court on January 3, 1977. We expect an early decision on this question and if we were to install these signs and the court ruled against us then we would have to remove and replace all these signs.

At the present time, this area is scheduled to be posted in April, weather permitting, and if the court rules in our favor, we will divert our entire force to posting the entire City.

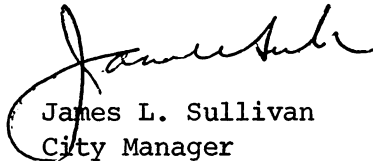
