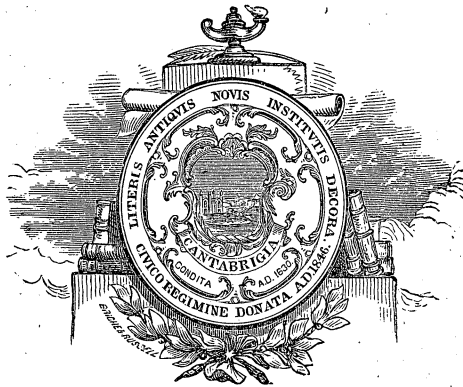


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, Oct. 4. 1865.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that Garden Street, between Lincoln Street and Wyeth Street should be widened so as to be fifty feet in width

that this Board intends to widen the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as a public street — and that Wednesday, the 10th day of October current at 2 o'clock, P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
