The Executive Committee of the Cambridgeport Residents Union (CRU) strongly urges every member of the City Council to fulfill his or her obligation as an elected official by providing the city with a City Manager who will deal effectively with the many problems that plague Cambridge and all its neighborhoods. We are deeply distressed at the current state of affairs in Cambridge. The city is floundering from lack of leadership. It has been six months since the election, yet no one has been named to lead the city.
