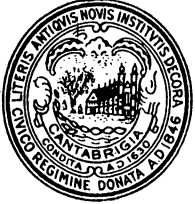

Pursuant to a communication from the Secretary of State re: "Harvard Debate, Incorporated", I made an investigation. The locus is suitable.

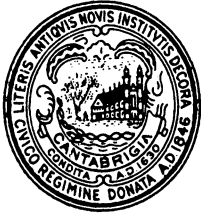

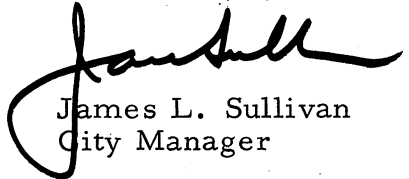
