Will you, in your official capacity, present a petition from the Polish residents of Cambridge to your fellow members of the City Council?

Some 420 men and women, members of the St. Hedwig's Parish served in the Armed Forces during World War II. Thirteen made the Supreme Sacrifice and lie buried in foreign soil. The members of ~~the~~ St. Hedwig's are very desirous of perpetuating their memory by having the Junctions of Otis and Fourth Sts. named after the first of their number to fall i.e. Edward Sniegiecki Square.

Will this brief petition suffice or will it be necessary for some one to make a personal appearance while the Council is in session?
