WHEREAS: Carrie was the beloved mother of John Marshall and Anna Jones and grandmother of five, all who will miss her very much; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family and friends of Carrie Turnbow at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family of Carrie Turnbow on behalf on the entire City Council.
