WHEREAS: SPARE CHANGE is a monthly newspaper that was created to help homeless Americans and to combat homelessness in our society. Since its first edition, SPARE CHANGE has helped 15 homeless people transition into private housing and become self-sufficient; and

WHEREAS: SPARE CHANGE has recently moved its office to the Old Cambridge Baptist Church; and

WHEREAS: November 22-28, 1992 is Homeless Awareness Week, its goal being to promote general awareness and understanding of the homeless and the economically disadvantaged; now-~~therefore be it~~

RESOLVED: That the entire Cambridge City Council hereby welcome and commend SPARE CHANGE and its managing editor, Tim Hobson, its publicist, Dolores Dell, and staff; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Council proclaim the week of November 22, 1992 as Homeless Awareness Week, and do urge all residents to reflect on the societal ill of homelessness and to lend a hand in combating homelessness in our City and in our country.
