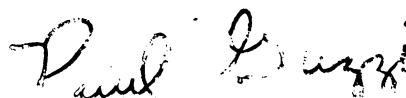

It is the intention of the Hayes House, Inc. to make a long-term commitment to living and working in the Riverside-Cambridgeport area of Cambridge which has a unique ethnic and racial mixture.

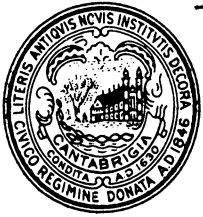
Among the specific activities of the corporation will be to help stop neighborhood deterioration by such purposes which shall include:

- a) the maintenance of low-cost housing for six family units;
- b) repairing and improving said property;
- c) promoting human and civil rights; and
- d) promoting communications within the neighborhood and thereby lessening tensions.

In addition, the Hayes House, Inc will help to eliminate prejudice and discrimination by activities which shall include but not be limited to:

- a) presenting public forums, slide shows, and informal discussions;
- b) presenting various cultural events to enhance understanding; and
- c) maintaining an informal book and pamphlet-lending service for the community.

It is our hope that the Hayes House, Inc. will be able to develop an informal atmosphere where persons from all walks of life can feel welcome and comfortable.

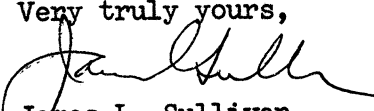
