ORDERED:

May 5, 1931.

On the petition of Edwin J. Colby

that artificial stone sidewalks be laid on the streets hereinafter named, under the direction of the Superintendent of Streets, and in accordance with the printed contract and specifications prepared by the Street Department.

The entire cost of the work to be paid by the petitioner, provided that wherever no stone or brick sidewalk has previously been laid by the City, the Superintendent of Streets is authorized to pay to the contractor performing the work the sum of six cents per square foot for all such artificial stone sidewalks laid in accordance with this order. The amount so expended to be charged to the appropriation for Street Department, Paving, Edgestones and Sidewalks.
