The undersigned respectfully prays

represents that- she and her sister own an estate at the corner of Pearl and Auburn Streets; that the Superintendent of Streets who is laying a brick sidewalk on Pearl Street has given her notice that her fence and steps encroach upon Pearl Street about eleven inches and has given her notice to remove the same within ten days.

She respectfully represents that the fence and steps have occupied precisely the same position for a period of upwards of fifty years, as can easily be proved by a score of witnesses in the neighborhood.

Wherefore she respectfully represents that if the City desires that Pearl Street should be widened at that point, it is just and reasonable that compensation should be made for the land taken and the expense of removing and replacing the fence and steps.
