ORDERED: That in accord with City Council Order Number One of September 24, 1996, the City Council reaffirm and petition the State Legislature to enact each City of Cambridge home rule petition that has yet to be enacted by the Legislature with the exception of "An Act to Continue Affordability in Governmentally Involved Housing in the City of Cambridge, to wit:

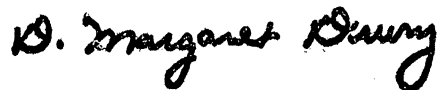
1. "AN ACT TO EXEMPT CERTAIN INCOME PRODUCING ASSETS FROM THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR AN ELDERLY TAX ABATEMENT;" and
2. "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF TRAFFIC, PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE TO ESTABLISH SPEED LIMITS FOR AND TO INSTALL SPEED BUMPS ON RESIDENTIAL PUBLIC WAYS;" and
3. "AN ACT REGULATING THE HOLDING OF ELECTIVE MUNICIPAL OFFICE IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE BY INDIVIDUALS INDICTED FOR OR CONVICTED OF CRIMINAL OFFENSES;" and
4. "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DIVISION OF CAPITAL PLANNING ON OPERATIONS TO CONVEY A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE;" And

5. "AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE LICENSING OF CERTAIN MOTOR CARRIERS IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE;" and
6. "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CAMBRIDGE LICENSE COMMISSION TO PUSH BACK THE OPENING TIME FOR PACKAGE STORE SALES TO TEN O'CLOCK ANTEMERIDIAN;" And be it further

ORDERED: That the home rule petition entitled "AN ACT TO CONTINUE AFFORDABILITY IN GOVERNMENTALLY INVOLVED HOUSING IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE" be placed on the table with the view in mind of discussion by the City Council at the November 18, 1996 meeting.
