WHEREAS: Jean Caulder Tibbils, a gentle, talented Cambridge artist and teacher, died at a young age on February 24 after a long illness; and

WHEREAS: Jeannie gave of herself generously as a performer and teacher to children whom she engaged in her performances and inspired by her teaching; and

WHEREAS: Jeannie's writing on nature graced the pages of the Cambridge Chronicle leaving what the Chronicle has called "a singular legacy of wonderment;" and

WHEREAS: In November during her illness, Jeannie joined other artists in a trip to the Soviet Union as part of the Cambridge Peace Commission's sister city program with Yerevan, Armenia SSR; therefore, it is hereby

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby notes its great sadness at the untimely death of Jean Caulder Tibbils and sends its message of sympathy to Jeannie's son Joachim, a student at the Pilot School of Cambridge Rindge and Latin School and to her Mother Mary Jean Tibbils of Hawaii; and be it further
