

City of Cambridge.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

An Ordinance
in relation to the establishing and
maintenance of schools for the education
of persons over fifteen years of age.

Be it ordained by the City Council
of the City of Cambridge as follows:—

Sec. 1. In addition to the schools
required by law to be maintained
in the City of Cambridge, there are
herby established three public schools
for the education of persons over
fifteen years of age.

Sec. 2. Said schools shall be located
in such parts of the City as the School
Committee may, from time to time,
determine, and may be held for
three evenings in each week, during
the months of November, December,
January, February and March,
between the hours of seven and nine
o'clock.

Sec. 3. The School Committee shall have the same superintendance over said schools as they have over other schools in the City, and shall determine what branches of learning may be taught therein.

Sec. 4. Such sums of money only shall be expended for the maintenance of said schools as shall from time to time be expressly appropriated therefor by the City Council.
