

Edward Greene

Harvard police officer

Edward V. Greene died May 13 in Brockton after a short illness. He was 56.

Born in Cambridge, he was a longtime Cambridge resident. He graduated from Rindge Technical School, and was a police officer at Harvard University for 25 years. He was a veteran of the Korean War.

He was husband of Shirley (Mercer); father of Michael, and Edward Jr; brother of Lewis Greene.

A funeral Mass was held at St. Paul AME Church, followed by interment at the Cambridge Cemetery.
