- WHEREAS: Work restitution is now a commonly utilized alternative sentence by the Massachusetts courts, one that requires Youth Offenders found guilty of defacing or destroying public or private property to restore what they have vandalized or destroyed; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to inquire of the office of the District Attorney and the Chief Justice of the Eastern Middlesex District Court to what extent work restitution programs are sought and assigned to Cambridge youth convicted of vandalizing property; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager develop and publicize within the public and private sectors his readiness to have the City of Cambridge cooperate in all respects with the development and expansion of such programs where youth specialists, probation officers and court authorities so recommend.
