Stephen E. Smith, kin to JFK, managed campaigns, dies at 62

Stephen E. Smith, brother-in-law and former campaign manager of President John F. Kennedy, died Sunday at his Manhattan home after a long illness. He was 62.

Mr. Smith, the husband of Jean Kennedy Smith, managed Kennedy's 1960 presidential campaign.

Family members, including his wife and Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, were with him when he died, a Kennedy spokesman said.

"For 34 years, from the day he married Jean, Steve was like a brother in our family," Sen. Kennedy said. "He was the wisest adviser and the most skillful campaign manager and the best friend that anyone of us ever had."

"There wouldn't have been a Camelot without Steve Smith."

As president of Boston's John F. Kennedy Library Corp., Mr. Smith was involved in finding the location for the library, museum and state archives at Columbia Point, Dorchester.

He was also on the President's Council of the Center for Interna-

tional Studies at New York University.

Mr. Smith was born in New York City and graduated from Georgetown University in 1948.

He joined the US Air Force as first lieutenant in 1952 and was discharged in 1953.

In 1956, Mr. Smith was associated with Sutton Producing and Mokeen Oil Corps. and the Independent Texas oil finders and producers.

In 1958, he worked for the Massachusetts re-election campaign of John F. Kennedy and later was appointed as finance chairman and media director of Kennedy's general election campaigns.

Four years later, Mr. Smith was the campaign manager for Edward Kennedy's election to the US Senate and, in 1964, was campaign manager for Sen. Robert F. Kennedy's election to the Senate from New York.

Mr. Smith leaves his wife; two sons, William and Stephen E. Jr.; and two daughters, Kym and Amanda.

A funeral Mass will be said tomorrow at 10 a.m. in St. Thomas More Church, New York City.

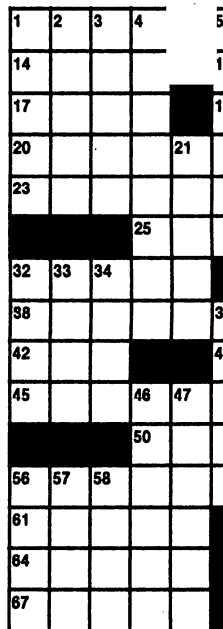
