WHEREAS: Marcus Morton, a native son of Newton, graduated from Yale in 1916 prior to his attendance at Harvard Law School and his admission to the Bar in 1921 and served as an Assistant United States Attorney from 1925-1928 and achieved great success and respect in the practice of law as a member of the firm of Hale, Sanderson, Byrnes and Morton of Boston; and

WHEREAS: Marcus Morton, in both his public and private careers, conducted himself as a real gentleman, giving generously of his time and efforts to all who sought his counsel and won the admiration of his colleagues by his dedication and the high standards that he displayed in his civic and private endeavors; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council, in session assembled on May 7, 1979, extend to Marcus Morton its humble expression of esteem for him in serving the City of Cambridge so faithfully and so well, and its best wishes for good health, success and prosperity in the years to come.
