In Board of Aldermen, May 12th 1869.

The Committee on Roads & Bridges would submit the following report on the petition of L. R. Melliston et al, asking that Chauncy St may be continued across Garden to Concord Avenue.

They find that it is in contemplation to greatly improve and beautify this portion of our City.

The State has already appropriated three hundred dollars (\$300) towards said improvements, and has promised an additional four hundred (\$400) when they are completed. The residents in the vicinity have subscribed seven hundred dollars (\$700) to purchase the land through which to extend Chauncy St, and to have a small common at that place. The petitioners now ask the City to do its part towards extending said Street, and in consideration of the large amount subscribed by the State and by private individuals, your committee do not consider their request

to be at all unreasonable. They therefore recommend that the City accept the extension when the aforesaid Street is continued to Concord Avenue, and is properly graded to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets, and when the petitioners furnish a plan of said extension to be approved by the City Engineer.

They further recommend that the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) be appropriated by the City Council towards defraying the expense of said extension, upon the conditions contained in the accompanying order.
