- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of retired Police Captain and Director of Civil Defense Chester E. Hallice, Sr.; and
- WHEREAS: Chester was a long time Cantabrigian and attended local public schools and in 1936 was appointed as a Patrol Officer in the Police Department; and
- WHEREAS: Chester rose through the ranks, graduating from the State Police Academy, the F.B.I. National Academy in Quantico and the Criminal Justice Management Program at Babson College, to attain the position of Captain, the rank from which he retired in 1972, completing thirty-six years of dedicated service to the Department and to the citizens of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: It was his strong commitment to public service that brought him out of retirement to serve as Director of Civil Defense, a job he held with distinction until his death; and
- WHEREAS: "Chet" was an outstanding law enforcement officer and became an expert in civil preparedness whose advice was often sought by other officials across the Commonwealth; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Julia (Corkery) Hallice and the entire Hallice family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Hallice on behalf of the entire City Council.
