- WHEREAS: These employees through Local 195 will soon be entering the collective bargaining process in the pursuit of increased wages; and
- WHEREAS: There has been much discussion throughout the City and within the Union that employees working within the Hospital and the Neville Manor may be requested to accept smaller wage increases than offered their counterparts throughout the City; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That it is the sense of this City Council that whatever wage increases are offered from the administration be offered equally and equitably to all members of Local 195, including those employees assigned to the Hospital and Neville Manor.
