RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of **Robert S. Teahan** at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

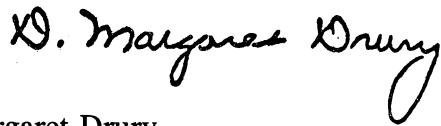

Robert S. Teahan, 76, former state lawmaker

A funeral Mass will be celebrated today for Robert S. Teahan of Whitman, a former state representative, high school football coach and a scout for the New England Patriots.

Mr. Teahan died Friday at his summer home in the Harwichport section of Harwich. He was 76.

He was born in Holyoke and was graduated from St. Anselm's College in Manchester, N.H., and received a master's degree in history and physical education from Bridgewater State College.

During World War II, he served in Europe with the Army and fought in the Battle of the Bulge.

He taught junior high school history and physical education and coached bas-

For 25 years he was athletic director and head football coach at Whitman-Hanson Regional High School.

In 1974, he resigned as football coach at West Bridgewater High School to run for the state Legislature and served as a representative from 1975 to 1978.

He became a full-time scout for the Patriots in 1979.

In 1981, he was inducted into the Massachusetts High School Football Coaches Hall of Fame. He was a member of the Whitman Democratic Town Committee.

He is survived by his wife, two sons, two daughters, a brother and a granddaughter.

The funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. at Holy Ghost Church in Whitman. Burial will be in St. James.
