- WHEREAS: The American Red Cross provides emergency care, food, clothing, and shelter to families temporarily displaced by fire, flood, and other disasters; and
- WHEREAS: The American Red Cross assists current and veteran military personnel and their families to relay thousands of messages of birth, death, and illness to military posts worldwide; and
- WHEREAS: The American Red Cross maintains a not-for-profit blood system which depends solely on volunteer donors, consistent with the principles of the American National Red Cross; and
- WHEREAS: The American Red Cross continues to disseminate information concerning the prevention of the spread of the AIDS virus and fights hazards to health and safety by training in first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, occupational safety, and water safety; and
- WHEREAS: The American Red Cross is constantly changing and updating its programs to meet the unique needs of the local community, largely through extensive voluntary support; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby join with the entire Cambridge community in proclaiming March, 1989, AMERICAN RED CROSS MONTH in the City of Cambridge, and urge all my fellow citizens to join me in recognizing this outstanding organization and its contribution to the quality of life in our City.

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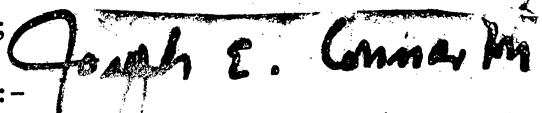
