RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby proclaim April 25, 1995 as NATIONAL YOUTH SERVICE DAY in the City of Cambridge, joining with the United States Conference of Mayors, the Jefferson Awards, the Lutheran Brotherhood, the Points of Light Foundation, Youth Service America, and the Youth Volunteer Corps of America in supporting this national initiative; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby encourage all residents of this city, youth and adult alike, to participate in the festivities on this great day, and to urge all of our youth to become active in the crusade to build a brighter tomorrow.
