Jim Hightower, America's popular progressive populist, is one of the most respected "outside Washington" leaders in the United States. Author, radio commentator, public speaker and political sparkplug, Jim Hightower has spent more than two decades battling Washington and Wall Street on behalf of consumers, children, working families, environmentalists, and just-plain-folks.

Representative Marie St. Fleur was elected to the Massachusetts State Legislature in 1999. Having won a hotly contested race, her outstanding legislative campaign earned a Progressive Leadership Award from the Commonwealth Coalition. Rep. St. Fleur represents the 5th Suffolk District and is the first Haitian American ever to hold an elected seat in Massachusetts.

Dick Mason, a CPPAX member since 1976, has been a tireless activist on Central America, Middle East, single-payer health care, economic justice issues, and electing progressives to office. He has devoted a significant part of his life to the efforts and campaigns of CPPAX.

DIRECTIONS

From the West: Take 90 East (Mass Pike) to Exit #18 (Cambridge-Allston). Follow signs to Cambridge. Cross bridge and turn right onto Memorial Drive. The Howard Johnson Hotel will be on your left after Polaroid.

From North-South: Take Route 93 to Storrow Drive. Go west on Storrow Drive. Exit left at Kendall Square. Take first right to cross over Longfellow Bridge. At end of bridge, take sharp right, loop around, and take a right onto Memorial Drive west. Howard Johnson Hotel is 1.5 miles on the right.

From Cambridge: Take Western Ave from Central Square. Go to the Charles River, take a left onto Memorial Drive. The Howard Johnson Hotel will be on your left after Polaroid.

By Public Transportation: Take the Red Line to Central Station. Take Bus #47 from the intersection of Pearl and Magazine Streets to the stop at Putnam Ave. The hotel is one block away.
