IN CITY COUNCIL,

April 1, 1919.

Ordered:

That common sewers be laid in the streets hereinafter named, the same to be built by contract or by the day, with, or without advertising for proposals therefor, at the option of the City Engineer, and the expense thereof to be charged to the appropriation for Sewers (Construction:—Sundry Sewers). Estates benefitted to be assessed according to law.

1. In Bridge Street from Fourth Street to Water Street about 810 feet.
2. In Museum Street from Carver Street to Gorham Street about 600 feet.
3. In Fresh Pond Avenue from Vassal Lane to Concord Avenue about 1000 feet.
