Gentlemen, The undersigned respectfully represents that the Steam Engine now in use at the City Stables for the cracking of Stone, was purchased by him in 1864, and at that time was a second hand Engine of 8 Horse power. It has been in use for nearly 9 years, and at the present time is entirely inadequate to the wants of the Street-Department. I have made the necessary arrangements, subject to your approval for the purchase of a new Engine of 25 Horse power, at an estimated cost of Eight-hundred dollars, in

exchange for the old Engine
and Boiler. I would respectfully
ask for the passage of the
accompanying Order, under the
direction of the Committee
on Roads and Bridges.
