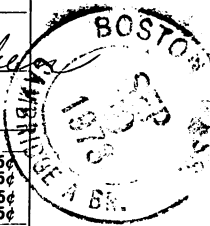

APPEAL.

CAMBRIDGE, September 14, 1973

TO THE SUPERINTENDENT OF BUILDINGS OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

The undersigned hereby appeals to the Board of Appeal from the following decision of the Superintendent of Buildings made August 30, 1973

The granting of a Building Permit to Arron Spencer, 266-270 Prospect Street, for a Drive-In Restaurant in a Bus.-A District without applicant seeking a Special Permit.

The appellant Anna Ricardo, et al here states briefly the grounds of and reasons for appeal from the decision of the Superintendent of Buildings above referred to

The appellant Anna Ricardo, et al, aggrieved of the decision rendered by the Superintendent of Buildings seek, under provisions of Chapter 40A, Section 13, an interpretive decision of the Zoning Ordinance by the Board of Zoning Appeal.

The Characteristic of the proposed development, Kentucky Fried Chicken, at 266-270 Prospect St., we feel are such that the appropriate category in Article IV, Section 2, Table of Use Regulations is Subsection 6b, Drive-In Restaurant, Drive-In Refreshment Stand and not the interpretation rendered by the Superintendent of Buildings, Subsection 5e, Lunchroom, Restaurant, Cafeteria, provided no alcoholic beverages are sold or consumed on the premises.

The layout and operation of this development is oriented to a drive-in consumer. At peak hours, 4:00-7:00 pm, 60 to 70 cars will utilize only 14 on site parking spaces. The interior layout of the development provides for only four tables. With high peak hour traffic volumes and minimal provision for sit-down customers, this development is unquestionably an auto-oriented, drive-in restaurant.
