of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully petition that the platform built out for loading goods, on the Albany Street front of new Factory Building on the South East corner of Main & Albany Streets Cambridgeport, owned by the petitioner George A. Gibson and occupied by the petitioner Irons & Pond Piano Co., may be allowed to remain where it is, for purposes of receiving & delivering goods. The Petitioners urge that this small favor be granted them, for the reasons that they have built a large amount of taxable property in Cambridge; have brought a large business and many men to said City permanently; that the larger part of the travel on Albany Street is the result of said Irons & Pond Piano Co.'s locating there and is to & from the other Factory of said Company on said Albany Street; that said Albany Street is not a thoroughfare; and that the platform aforesaid is practically no impediment to travel. For these reasons & because there are no reasons that petitioners can see for the removal of said platform this is respectfully submitted.
