That the polls will be open from eight o'clock A. M. on said date until eight o'clock P. M. on said date.

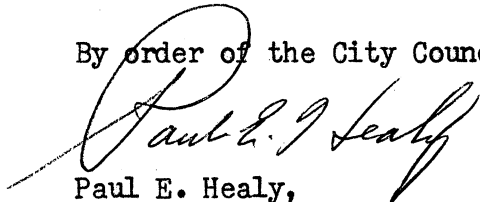

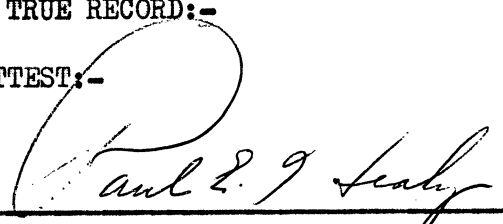

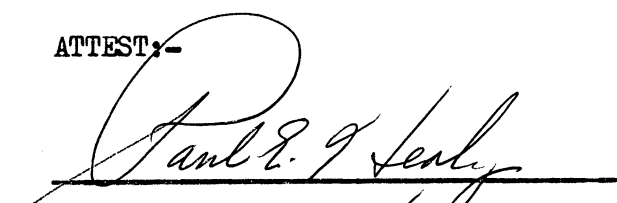
