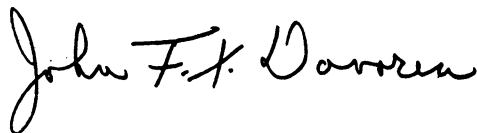

TRANSITIONAL RESIDENCES, INC.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

(1) To provide transitional residence, educational, recreational and vocational-training centers, and employment for persons of any race, religion, and nationality who have personal problems of a social and/or emotional nature and who are in need of supportive temporary lodging, in order to promote their personal, social, and vocational rehabilitation and well-being; to provide care, aid, guidance, supervision, instruction, training, employment, and lodging for selected persons with the aforesaid problems and for healthy members of the general public who will serve as role models and companions to the selected persons with the aforesaid problems; and to promote and maintain concern for the aforesaid purposes within the community surrounding the residences and centers, to arrange exchange of services with other organizations in that community, and to promote and carry out education, training and research in those fields which pertain to these purposes.

(2) To solicit, receive, hold, and administer gifts or grants for the purposes aforesaid.

3. To acquire, take, and hold by bequest, devise, grant, gift, purchase, exchange, lease, transfer, judicial order or decree, or otherwise, any property, real, personal, or mixed, without limitations as to value except such as may now or hereafter be prescribed by law; to borrow money, sell, mortgage, exchange, reconvey, transfer or otherwise dispose of any such property; to administer, invest, and reinvest its property and dispose of and expand the income and principal of the corporation in such ways as will in the judgment of the directors best promote the purposes of the corporation; to make and execute any agreements or instruments and do and perform any acts that may be in the judgment of the directors necessary to carrying out the purposes of the corporation; and to engage the services of such professional, administrative, and clerical personnel as the directors deems necessary and to fix the compensation of such personnel within the amounts made available for such purposes by the directors.

4. To carry on any Educational or Charitable function permitted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to a Non-Profit Corporation organized under Chapter 180 in furtherance of, but not in limitation of the general powers conferred by Chapter 180 of the General Laws as amended, and as further limited by the exempt purposes set forth in Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code as amended.

5. If the purposes for which the Corporation is formed as listed above shall be unattainable or should the Corporation fail and be dissolved, such dissolution shall take place only after payment of all legal obligations and debts has been made, and any and all excess capital shall transfer to a Non-Profit corporation or Non-Profit organization whose purposes are similar to those enumerated above.

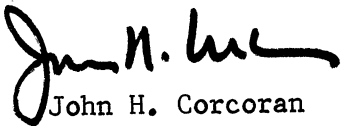
