TO ALL CITIZENS OF CAMBRIDGE:

The Public Works Department has been severely critized by some, and praised by others for the decision this summer to enforce the Anti-Litter Ordinances, with respect to the disposal of brush leaves and grass clippings. In some isolated cases, residents have refused to cooperate and continue to dispose of material on the sidewalks and gutters. The Public Works Dept. has had to continue to collect this material at increased municipal costs to all for the actions of a few. A list has been compiled of all material dumped on the public ways and notification will be made to all persons involved.

Residents are reminded of the Ordinances which are included below, and are asked to help keep the cost of un-necessary services to a minimum.

Chapter 41, Section 7, Sub-section 6 of the Anti-Litter Ordinance provides that all grass clippings and fallen leaves to be collected by the City shall be stored in authorized rubbish containers. The use of heavy plastic bags tied securely at the top is encouraged for this type of collection.

The Ordinance further states: "Small shrub and trees shall be stored in authorized rubbish containers or shall be tied securely in bundles not exceeding two feet in length, ten inches in diameter or a total of one hundred pounds in weight. Such bundles shall be set out in the same places and under the same restrictions as those for authorized receptacles. Burning of leaves or other materials outdoors is strictly prohibited."

Section 8, PENALTIES, provides that "any person who shall violate any provision of the Ordinance shall be prosecuted and will be liable to a fine not to exceed \$50.00. Each day's failure to comply shall constitute a separate offense."

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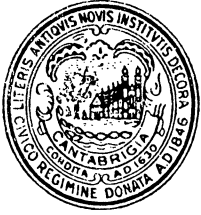
