Appropriation for
Streets and Paving.
April 4, 1871.

Cambridge, April 11, 1871.

The Committee on Finance to whom was referred the Report of the Committee on Roads and Bridges in which the suggestion was made that an additional Appropriation be made for Streets and Paving; and who were instructed to "consider the expediency of appropriating more money" for that purpose, have considered the subject, and respectfully Report:-

That the appropriation for Streets and Paving, as it now stands, will be barely sufficient to carry into effect Orders of the City Council already adopted, together with the cost of the ordinary works upon streets during the present financial year. Unless an additional Appropriation is made the construction of sidewalks and the carrying out of other improvements, (all of which are pressed upon the attention of the City Council by citizens with great zeal and force of argument) will have to be abandoned for this year. In view of the general desire for these conveniences and improvements, and of the manifest advantage to the city which will result from them, your Committee recommends an additional Appropriation of the

sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars
for Streets and Paving; and that the accompany-
ing Order be adopted.
