To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report No. 12 regarding the clean-up of the trash and debris along the Railroad Right-of-Way between Porter Square and Alewife Station, I have requested that the MBTA enforce a regular maintenance schedule along the corridor. The particular program referred to in the July 25 Council Order was a special initiative to clean-up the area along a discontinued railroad freight line between Cedar and Grove Streets in Somerville. The MBTA cleared railroad ties and brush in cooperation with a Department of Environmental Management project which will construct a bicycle path from Davis Square to Lexington.
