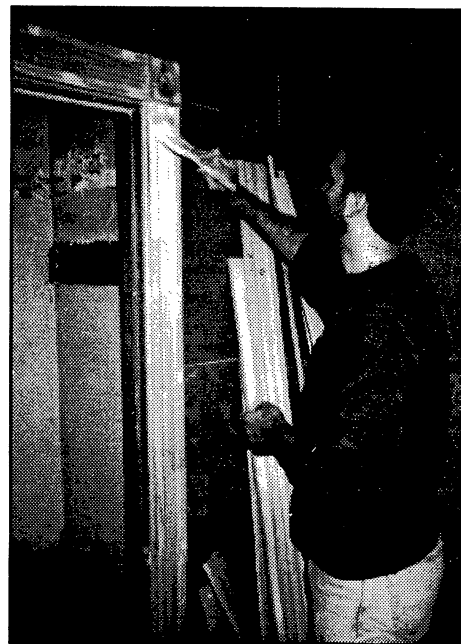
With your time and expertise:

- Mentors to guide and befriend those seeking to make the transition from homelessness to autonomy as productive employees—all member groups
- Grant writing, fundraising, special event planning—IA and all member groups
- Haircuts
- Cooking breakfast on a weekly basis—On the Rise

With in-kind donations:

- Internet access
- Building supplies and tools
- Supplies for our offices—general office supplies, modem (14.4 or higher), IBM-compatible computer (486 or higher), bulletin boards, art supplies
- Equipment for our centers, safe havens, building and repair projects, and the Furniture Bank—all kinds of furniture, lockers, VCR, Teflon frying pan, radio/stereo, washers/dryers, refrigerators, a range
- T passes, clothing, and personal items—for the Children's Clothing Exchange, the Self-Advocacy Center, and the Safe Haven (which especially prizes toiletries in travel sizes, backpacks and lightweight duffel bags, new underwear, socks, bras, and stockings, gloves, mittens, hats, warm socks, blankets, pocket date books, larger sizes of women's clothing, magazine subscriptions, e.g. Ms., Vogue, Essence, unused make-up, jewelry, gift certificates—especially for haircuts!), and non-perishable food such as tuna, cereal, peanut butter, crackers, coffee, tea, hot cocoa mix

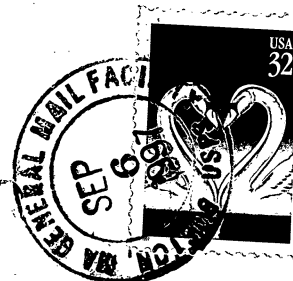
