- WHEREAS: Frederick A. Centanni was a lifelong resident of Cambridge and was internationally recognized in the field of economic development and in manpower programs; and
- WHEREAS: He was Commissioner of Commerce and Development for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and
- WHEREAS: He was the first chairman of the Steering Committee and a member of the first industrial advisory board for Action for Boston Community Development; and
- WHEREAS: He was chairman of the Middlesex House of Correction advisory board, a member of the first board of directors for the Cambridge Unified Health, Hospitals and Welfare Department, and vice-chairman of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Manpower Planning Council Subcommittee for Policy; and
- WHEREAS: He received an Outstanding Citizen award for community assistance; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the portion of Otis Street between Second Street and Third Street be dedicated as public open space; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That this park be dedicated to and named the Frederick A. Centanni Park in recognition of his contributions to the greater Cambridge community and to his beloved East Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution be presented to the Centanni Family at the dedication on Sunday, May 7, 1989 from 3:00 - 5:00 P.M. at Centanni Park, Otis Street, East Cambridge.
