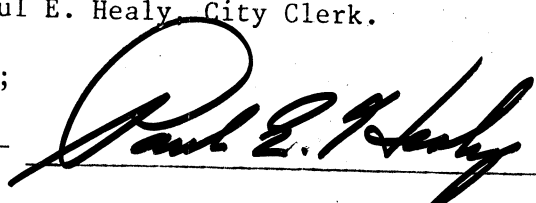
RESOLVED:

That the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts, U.S.A., hereby resolves to request the appropriate officials of Turkey to make public the reasons for the arrest of Mahmut Kikerdem and to advise whether the rights of this person are being observed under the United National Universal Declaration of Human Rights. As elected government officials in a democratic society, the Cambridge City Councillors wish to say to Turkish officials that political activity should never result in the violation of a person's liberty, and further that disregard of the personal rights of members of political opposition creates a destabilizing force in the world.
