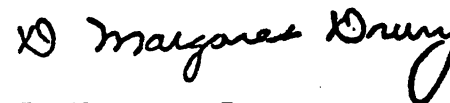

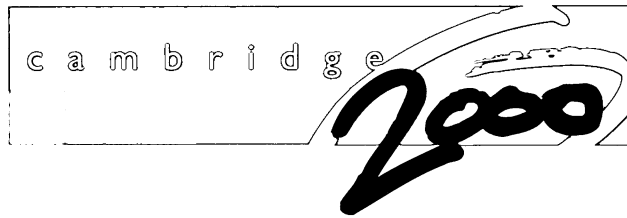

To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$3,000,000 in funds provided to the City by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) to the Public Investment Fund Public Works Extraordinary Expenditures Account. The funds will be used for the construction of a storm drain in South Massachusetts Avenue between Lafayette Square and Memorial Drive. In accordance with an agreement between the City and MIT, MIT will reimburse the City \$3,000,000 out of a total project cost of \$8,500,000 with the City providing the remaining \$5,500,000 through a previously-approved loan authorization. The existing storm drain which, services the surrounding area buildings, has insufficient capacity for current demand when a major storm occurs. With MIT planning to build several new facilities in the area, the demand upon the existing storm drain will increase, thus necessitating the construction of a new drain to meet the increased demand.
