- WHEREAS: It was with deep sorrow that this City Council learned of the death of William Cleary, Sr., retired Superintendent of Recreation; and
- WHEREAS: Bill Cleary began his career with the City of Cambridge in 1926 as a playground director, working his way up the career ladder to attain the top position in the Recreation Department in 1957, a position he held until his retirement in 1966; and
- WHEREAS: Bill was a former baseball and hockey official, a job he thoroughly enjoyed for 30 years, a job which included his officiating at every home baseball game of Holy Cross College for 23 years; and
- WHEREAS: Bill was named an official of the Canadian-American Hockey League in 1931 and was a familiar figure as a referee on the ice of the Boston Garden; and
- WHEREAS: Bill's athletic abilities were certainly inherited by his two sons, William and Robert, who were members of the U.S. Olympic Hockey Team which won the world championship in 1960; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our deepest sympathy to Mrs. Helen Cleary and to her entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution on behalf of this entire City Council to Mrs. Cleary.
