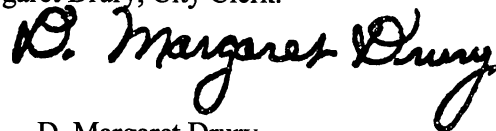

WHEREAS: On September 30, 2004 the Cambridge YWCA will hold its 17th Annual Tribute to Outstanding Women; and

WHEREAS: At this gala luncheon, the YWCA will celebrate the achievements of ten outstanding women; and

WHEREAS: Mrs. Suzanne Revaleon Green will receive the Margaret Fuller Lifetime Award; and

WHEREAS: This newly created award is presented to a woman of distinction in Cambridge whose life has embodied the legacy of Margaret Fuller, a strong advocate of freedom as well as a philosopher and activist; and

WHEREAS: In the 1930's Mrs. Green refused official advise to "go south," she challenged the system and won to become only the seventh black teacher in the Cambridge schools; and

WHEREAS: In 1937 she broke legal ground by successfully challenging a law that prohibited married women from teaching. Subsequently she became a teacher and assistant director at the Opportunities Industrialization Center, from which she retired in 1979; and

WHEREAS: Mrs. Green has served on the Cambridge Historical Commission as well as on many boards in the community, among them those of the YWCA and the Margaret Fuller House; and

WHEREAS: The NAACP, Cambridge Peace Commission, and Salem State College have honored her; now therefore be it
