Gentlemen-

The Board of Park Commissioners at its meeting on May 16th, received two orders under dates of May 9th and 16th, respectively, relative to continuing erection of wire fence on Library Grounds, from the entrance of Library at Irving Street to Cambridge Street; and a request that permits be issued for playing soccer, hurling, and gaelic football at Russell Field.

The Board voted to continue the fence now standing, (iron rails thru' wooden posts) from the entrance of Library at Irving Street to Cambridge Street; and to rescind former action prohibiting soccer, hurling and gaelic football being played at Russell Field, and to consider each application for either of the sports mentioned, spearately.
