

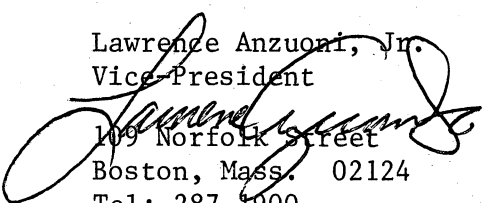

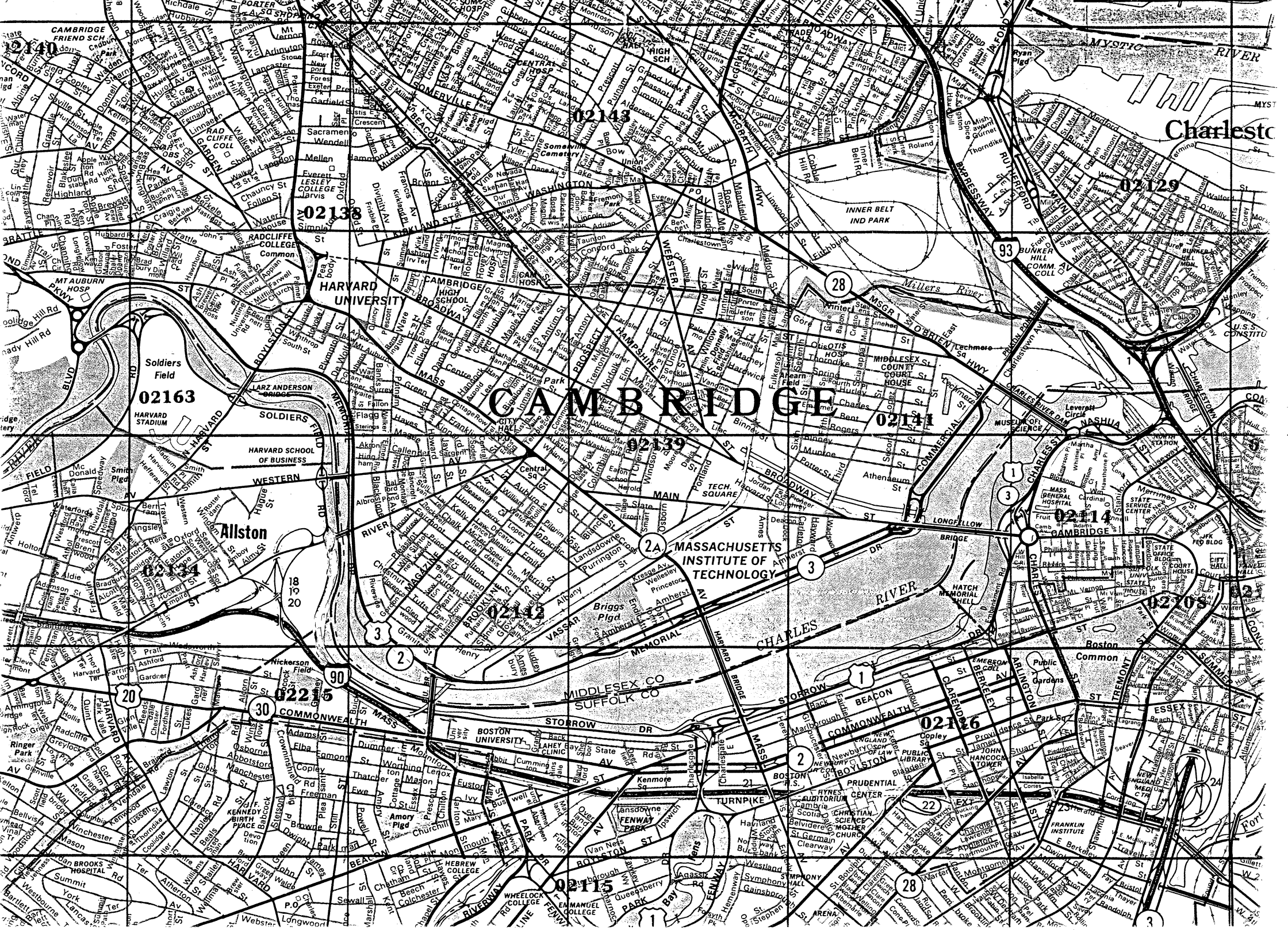

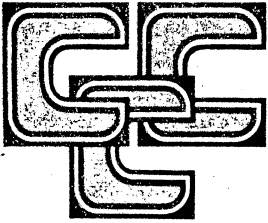

As you are undoubtedly aware, tourism in Greater Boston is booming. Even with the closure of the Hynes Auditorium Boston can expect a "record breaker" in 1986. Late 1987 and 1988 will see the opening of the Hynes and with it a whole new surge of convention and visitor activity.

There were 400,000 delegates and 9.6 million visitors in Greater Boston during 1985. These visitors contributed \$2.4 billion in total economic impact, \$165 million in state tax revenue, \$41 million went into City of Boston coffers. Equally important is the fact that this industry employs almost 60,000 people throughout Greater Boston.

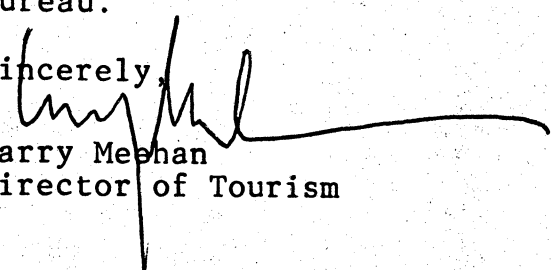
The Bureau is committed to servicing this important economic growth. This growth has not been limited to the city of Boston.

In Cambridge, in the last three years there have been three major hotel developments: the doubling of rooms at the Royal Sonesta; the opening of the Charles Hotel in 1985 and the opening this fall of the Marriott/Cambridge Center. Although in Boston (Allston) the opening of the Embassy Suites along the Charles River has added to the activity in Cambridge. 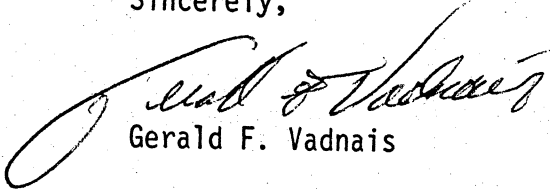

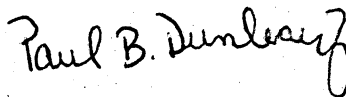

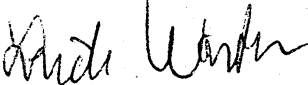
